Summary

The programme entailed the creation of a network of 13 schools in the regions of the Peloponnese, Crete and Southern Aegean, and was intended to confront the challenges of the contemporary multicultural school by utilizing the art of theatre and experience-based pedagogical methods. In the context of the programme, the instructors in charge of each of the participating schools and the directors of the Health Education Departments of the Primary Education Directorates of the regions of Argolis, Laconia, Corinth, Cyclades, the Dodekanese, Rethymnon, Chania, Lasithi and Herakleion, received training related to Intercultural Education, Research activities and the teaching methods of Drama in Education as well as other forms of applied theatre. The training was carried out at the University of the Peloponnese in February 2007. Next, the instructors in charge implemented programmes of intercultural education in their respective school units. These programmes were evaluated and collected in a volume intended for teachers.
